Explain: The review area contains two wetlands labeled Wetland 1 and Wetland 2 on the attached figure MVP-2019-00497-AIS page 2 of 5. These wetlands are not bordering, contiguous with, or neighboring another WOUS nor are these aquatic resourcs separated from another WOUS by man-made dikes, barriers, or berms. The closest tributary is approximately 1,700 feet to the northwest of the wetlands and the surrounding soil is all predominantly non-hydric.

The wetlands do not support a link to interstate or foreign commerce; are not known to be used by interstate or foreign travelers for recreation or other purposes; do not produce fish or shellfish that could be taken and sold in interstate or foreign commerce; and are not known to be used for industrial purposes by industries in interstate commerce. Furthermore, these wetlands are hydrologically isolated with no surface or shallows ubsurface connections to a water of the United States and do not have an ecological interconnection due to existing disturbance. Therefore, the Corps has determined that Wetland 1 and Wetland 2 are not regulated by the Corps under Section 404 of the Clean Water Act.
