A review of available resources confirmed the wetlands investigated are located within enclosed depressions that have no surface water connections to intermittent or perennial tributaries. The investigated wetlands are physically removed from the nearest A(1)-A(3) water, and there is no evidence that they are directly abutting an A(1) – A(3) water. The investigated wetlands were determined to be hydrologically isolated and are therefore not regulated by the Corps under Section 404 of the Clean Water Act. The wetlands do not abut at least one point or side of, a paragraph (a)(1)-(3) water. |
