Explain: The review area includes three wetlands, labeled Wetland A, Wetland B, and Wetland C on the enclosed figure MVP-2019-02075-AIS Page 2 of 6.

The Corps completed a delineation concurrence based on a 2011 delineation for this site in March of 2012 and found no wetlands at these sites. There were data points taken in what is now Wetland A and Wetland C that were determined not to be wetland points. While the concurrence was not re-reviewed after five years, the lack of wetlands on the property eight years ago is indicative of their current status. The soils surrounding Wetland B and Wetland C are non-hydric.

These wetlands developed as a result of excavation in a previously non-wetland/upland area, and they are not jurisdictional waters of the U.S. (WOUS) under Section 404 of the CWA. The purpose of the excavation was not to restore or create wetland at this location, it was created incidental to ongoing construction and grading activities on the property. The non-jurisdictional determination for Wetland A, Wetland B, and Wetland C was completed pursuant to the preamble to the 1986 Corps Regulations (33 CFR Parts 320-330), which states that the Corps does not generally consider the following to be waters of the U.S.: "Waterfilled depressions created in dry land incidental to construction activity and pits excavated in dry land for the purpose of obtaining fill, sand, or gravel unless and until the construction or excavation operation is abandoned and the resulting body of water meets the definition of waters of the United States."

A review of aerial imagery shows that construction was clearly still occurring in 2017, while 2018 photos show an uncompleted asphalt driveway leading into the project site, indicating clear plans for future construction. We can therefore conclude that the site was not abandoned.
