



William Jones (1895-1897); Capt./Lt. Col. Edward Schulz (1907 and 1916-1917); Maj./Lt. Col. Francis Shunk (1907-1912); and Maj. Edwin Marks, 1921-1923 and 1924
- Longest Consecutive Tenure: Maj. Charles J. Allen (1878-1889), 11 Years 4 months
- Shortest District Engineer Tenure: 19 days Capt. Frank McAdams Albrecht (1937)
- First and Only (as of 2015) Civilian District Engineer: George Freeman (1917-1919)
- Lowest Ranking (as of 2015) District Engineer: 1st Lt. John N. Hodges (1912)
- First and Only (as of 2015) Minority District Engineer: Col. Joseph Briggs (1985-1988)
