




President Lyndon B. Johnson



President Franklin Roosevelt

- President Franklin Roosevelt visited the St. Paul District secretly on Sept. 19, 1942, to visit an ammunition plant in New Brighton, Minnesota, that was enlarged by the district to support the war effort.
- President Lyndon B. Johnson visited the district July 8, 1965, after devastating flooding on the Upper Mississippi River. The flood fight cost around \$1.5 million but saved around \$108 million in damages.
- President Jimmy Carter and First Lady Rosslyn Carter visited Lock and Dam 6, in Trempealeau, Wisconsin, in August 1979, when they took a river trip on the Delta Queen.
- President George W. Bush visited Lower St. Anthony Falls Lock and Dam in Minneapolis Aug. 4, 2007, after the I-35W bridge collapsed on top of the lock's guide wall Aug. 1, 2007.
