

History

The Eau Galle Dam and Reservoir, with its dam, lake, recreation areas and channel improvements, was authorized by the Flood Control Act of 1958 as a result of repeated flooding in the Spring Valley area. The 649-acre project was built from 1965-1968 and is located just north of Spring Valley, WI, 50 miles east of the Twin Cities and 40 miles west of Eau Claire, WI. The Eau Galle recreation area is operated by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, St. Paul District.

The large rolled-earth and rock-filled dam manages a 64-square-mile drainage basin of the Eau Galle River, which flows into the Chippewa River and eventually enters the Mississippi River. The outlet structures include an uncontrolled morning glory inlet that releases water from the surface and a vertical slide gate that releases water from the bottom.

In addition to providing downstream flood protection, the Eau Galle Dam and Reservoir provides numerous recreational opportunities and valuable habitat for native plants and animals.

April-October: \$5 per vehicle Nov.-March: No vehicle fee

- America the Beautiful Pass allows for free day use. Must display in vehicle window
- Campers: No fee, must display camping pass in vehicle

Picnic shelters reservations West shelter- \$30 East shelter- \$40

Rules:

- Open 6 a.m., Closes 10 p.m.
- No dogs or glass containers in or around the beach area
- No gasoline-powered boat use on the lake, electric only

Camping Fees

Non-electric site- \$20 Electric site- \$24 GS1, group tent site- \$30 Group camping loop electric (sites 28-38)- \$225

Campground Rules:

- Check in: 1 p.m., check out: 12 p.m.
- Quiet Hours: 10 p.m. to 6 a.m.
- All camping equipment and vehicles must be kept on the designated camping pad
- Fireworks, including sparklers, are prohibited
- Please extinguish campfires when off campsite
- Maximum camping stay of 14 consecutive days or 14 non-consecutive days in any 30 day period
