



The Winona Small Boat Harbor and Crooked Slough (Commercial) Harbor are located in the city of Winona, Minn. They are located at Upper Mississippi River mile 726.1 and 726.3 with the small boat harbor being downstream. The commercial harbor is on the right descending bank, while the small boat harbor is on left. The city of Winona is the non-federal sponsor for the project and has provided a suitable placement site for any dredged material.

Details

The small boat harbor was completed in May of 1958 at a cost of \$89,771. The length of the small boat harbor is 1,100 feet. The width of the harbor is 200 feet. The commercial harbor was completed in October 1956 at a cost of \$86,714. The shape is a wave that is 6,000 feet long and 200 feet wide. The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers is authorized to maintain the small boat harbor to a depth of 5 feet below the low control pool, and the commercial harbor to a depth of 9 feet below the low control pool elevation of 645.5 feet mean sea level.



Dredging

Since 1990, the Winona Small Boat Harbor has been dredged 14 times. The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers dredges to 6 feet to prolong the need for future dredging and to help provide enough clearance for dredging.
