Alma Small Boat Harbor

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The Alma Small Boat Harbor is upstream of Lock and Dam 4 and the city of Alma, Wis. It is located at Upper Mississippi River mile 839.7 on the left descending bank. The city of Alma is the non-federal sponsor for the project and is required to furnish a suitable placement site for the dredged material. The city has delegated its responsibility for the marina to the Alma Marina.

Details

The harbor was completed Nov. 1, 1963, at a cost of \$56,241. The length of the harbor is 730 feet and it is 225 feet wide. The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers is authorized to maintain the harbor to a depth of 5 feet below the low control pool elevation of 667.0 feet mean sea level.

Dredging

Since 1990, the Alma Small Boat Harbor has not been dredged by the Corps of Engineers. The Corps currently does not have any funding to dredge the harbor. Hydrographic surveys were done in 2008 to identify the water depth near the entrance to the harbor.
