
This application is being reviewed in accordance with the practices for documenting Corps jurisdiction under Sections 9 & 10 of the Rivers and Harbor Act of 1899 and Section 404 of the Clean Water Act identified in Regulatory Guidance Letter 07-01. We have made a preliminary determination that the aquatic resources that would be impacted by the proposed project are regulated by the Corps of Engineers under Section 404 of the Clean Water Act. Our jurisdictional review and final jurisdictional determination could result in modifications to the scope of the project's regulated waterbody/wetland impacts and compensatory mitigation requirements identified above. An approved jurisdictional determination will be made prior to reaching a permit decision, and will be posted on the St. Paul District web page at <http://www.mvp.usace.army.mil/>.

**Project Description and Purpose:** The applicant proposes routine pipeline maintenance work on a section of Line 5 within the exterior boundaries of the Bad River Indian Indian Reservation. The purpose of this maintenance work is to inspect, and if necessary, repair one section of pipeline. This would require excavation up to 80 feet long, 30 to 40 feet wide and up to 10 feet deep in order to inspect the pipeline and make any necessary repairs. The maintenance work is anticipated to be completed within 10-14 days. Access to the maintenance site would be from Government Road, traveling northwest along the Enbridge right-of-way to the maintenance location. Temporary timber mats would be


placed within all access route and temporary workspace within wetlands. It is expected that the mats would be in place for longer than two weeks.

**Name, Area and Types of Waters (Including Wetlands) Subject to Loss:** The project would result in temporary discharges of dredged and fill material n approximately 0.07 acres of wetlands adjacent to Rins Creek for the maintenance of Line 5 at Milepost 1164.2393 on the Bad River Indian Reservation. The project also includes the temporary placement of timber mats in an additional 1.45 acres wetlands needed for access and workspace. All wetland areas would be restored to pre-impact condition upon completion of the maintenance work and would not result in a loss of waters.


