
PROJECT DESCRIPTION AND PURPOSE: The Oneida Indian Tribe of Wisconsin has applied for a Department of the Army permit to develop a subdivision in the Village of Hobart, Brown County to provide housing for low to moderate income clientele. The proposal includes construction of seven apartment buildings, necessary infrastructure, and site development.

NAME, AREA AND TYPES OF WATERS (INCLUDING WETLANDS) SUBJECT TO IMPACT: Approximately 0.0241 acres of wetlands adjacent to an unnamed tributary of Duck Creek would be permanently filled as a result of the proposed residential development. These wetlands are of low quality fresh wet meadow located in an agricultural field and primarily surrounded by agricultural fields and roadways.

ALTERNATIVES CONSIDERED: Four additional alternatives were considered by the applicant including two different roadway connections to neighboring development. However these alternatives were ruled out due to resulting higher wetland impacts. Additionally, bridge construction over the wetlands was considered but eliminated due to high cost. The no-build alternative was also considered but was ruled out because it failed to address the need and purpose of the project.

MITIGATION: No mitigation was proposed by the applicant.




FIGURE 2
