#### D. ADDITIONAL COMMENTS TO SUPPORT JD:

This approved jurisdictional determination is only applicable to Wetland 1 on the enclosed figures labeled MVP-2017-01391-MVM Page 1 of 3 through Page 3 of 3.

Wetland 1 is an artificial pond constructed entirely in uplands. This was confirmed through a review of available aerial photography which shows pond construction occurred between 1991 and 2002. The Anoka County Soil Survey indicates soils in the area the pond was constructed are predominantly non-hydric. Lidar data shows the pond was constructed on an area that is several feet higher than the typical elevation contour of naturally-occurring wetlands in the surrounding area. We conclude that Wetland 1 is not a water of the U.S., and is not jurisdictional under the CWA.
