## First Aid

The park staff is trained to provide First Aid and CPR.

## CAMPING

1. Customers with reservations may proceed to assigned campsite.
2. Customers without reservations; Sites 1-9 and A-E are first-come first-serve. Open reservable sites are available for two nights without reservations.
3. Register at self-pay station when stop sign is out. Otherwise, fees are collected by ranger patrol.
4. Reservations may be made by calling 1-877-444-6777 or by visiting website [www.reserveusa.com](http://www.reserveusa.com).
5. Campers must vacate the campsite by 12 p.m. on the last day of their visit.
6. Quiet hours are 10 p.m. to 7 a.m. Please respect the privileges and privacy of others at all times.
7. All vehicles and trailers must be completely accommodated on the camping pad and drive-way. Only one family camping unit will be permitted per campsite.
8. The placement of camping equipment, vehicles, or other items on a campsite without overnight occupancy for the purpose of reserving a designated campsite for future use is prohibited. Violators may be fined and/or equipment will be removed from the park.

**NOTICE:** All persons entering upon Government property do so at their own risk. The United States assumes no responsibility for their loss or injury from the acts or conduct of other persons on the premises.

## NOTICE TO VISITORS

This public land is provided for safe, healthful recreation use by the visiting public. All visitors are welcome to enjoy this area under the provisions of applicable Federal laws and regulations.

Camping, picnicking, hiking, boating and swimming are allowed within the specific posted rules governing the use of these Federal lands.

### Prohibited uses or activities include, but are not limited to:

1. Horses, except in designated areas. (Horses are prohibited in Highland Ridge Campground.)
2. Defacement of any Federal property or natural features.
3. Littering and discharge of contaminants or sewage.
4. Fires in undesignated areas.
5. Use of any vehicle off authorized roadways.
6. Operation of a powered watercraft other than by electric motor.
7. Use of any firearms or lethal weapon.
8. Fireworks.
9. Unrestrained pets or domestic animals and failure to clean up after pets or domestic animals.
10. Glass containers and pets on or around the swimming beach.
11. Off-Road Vehicles and All-Terrain Vehicles.

Any person who violates the rules and regulations established by the Secretary of the Army in 36 CFR, Part 327, may be cited and referred to the U.S. Magistrate in accordance with Section 234 of the Flood Control Act of 1970.



**E**au Galle Recreation Area with its large rolled-earth dam controls a 64-square mile drainage basin of the Eau Galle River, which flows into the Chippewa River and eventually the Mississippi River. The Dam was constructed between 1965-1968 after repeated flooding of the Spring Valley Area. The 630-acre project that resulted provides numerous recreational opportunities and valuable habitat for native plants and animals. Much of the land prior to impound was agricultural. The 150-acre lake provides year-round fishing.
