Ground and aerial photos show an absence of a bed and bank and no ordinary high water mark.

Based on historic aerial photographs and topographic maps, these aquatic resources are ditches that were constructed in upland to convey surface water runoff from a highway exit/entrance ramp or from nearby parking lots. The soils are not mapped on the USGS web soil survey, but aerial photos show an absence of wet signatures and WWI maps do not show wetland polygons through them (A and G are mapped as wetlands on WWI but historic aerial photos show that they were constructed and not originally wetland). The topographic map indicates that these ditches are not in a topographically low area where wetlands would be present. F and G are ditches created after removal of the highway entrance ramp sometime in 2011. None of these aquatic resources were constructed in a tributary, relocate a tributary, or were constructed in adjacent wetlands.

Based on historic aerial photographs, WWI, and topographic maps, these wetlands are isolated depressions surrounded by upland. Wetlands H and L contain no inlets/outlets other than overland sheet flow. Wetland M is an open water pond with no inlets/outlets. Wetland N continues outside of the review area to the east. The portion of wetland N outside of the review area was reviewed for a previous AJD (2013-04712- AJK) and determined to be non-jurisdictional before the Navigable Waters Protection Rule took effect. Under the new rule, Wetland N is non-adjacent as it contains no inlets/outlets to an (a)(1)-(a)(3) water other than overland sheet flow. The closest tributary (within the same HUC) to these wetlands is unnamed, over 1,500 feet to
