 - Potentially jurisdictional waters and/or wetlands were assessed within the review area and determined to be not jurisdictional. Explain: The review area for this determination is limited to the boundaries of one man-made ditch located within the proposed construction limits at the base of the perimeter berm surrounding the northeast wastewater stabilization pond within Deer River's 3 pond system. The ditch extends west beyond the existing stabilization pond before ending in a culvert that conveys hydrology west downslope to the forested wetland complex. The ditch does not carry relatively permanent flow, but conveys precipitation runoff from the pond berm following precipitation events. The ditch is labeled Wetland 3 on the attached figures labeled 2020-00334-ARC Pages 1-5 of 5. The ditch is approximately 0.0848 acre (3,694 square feet) in size within the construction limits.

The ditch was constructed in uplands, drains only uplands, and does not carry a relatively permanent flow of water into waters of the U.S. (WOUS). This was confirmed by reviewing aerial photography, national hydrography data, and information provided in the November 2019 Wetland Delineation and the March 2020 Pre-Construction Notification. Per the Rapanos decision, the evaluated ditch is not a WOUS because it is not a tributary and does not have a significant nexus to traditionally navigable waters.

The ditch collects water from the pond berm and the upland rise to the north following precipitation events and does not carry a relatively permanent flow, therefore is not a WOUS.
