MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD

SUBJECT: US Army Corps of Engineers (Corps) Approved Jurisdictional Determination in accordance with the "Revised Definition of 'Waters of the United States'"; (88 FR 3004 (January 18, 2023) as amended by the "Revised Definition of 'Waters of the United States'; Conforming" (8 September 2023) ,<sup>1</sup> [MVP-2024-01320-KDZ MFR 1 of 1](#)<sup>2</sup>

BACKGROUND. An Approved Jurisdictional Determination (AJD) is a Corps document stating the presence or absence of waters of the United States on a parcel or a written statement and map identifying the limits of waters of the United States on a parcel. AJDs are clearly designated appealable actions and will include a basis of JD with the document.<sup>3</sup> AJDs are case-specific and are typically made in response to a request. AJDs are valid for a period of five years unless new information warrants revision of the determination before the expiration date or a District Engineer has identified, after public notice and comment, that specific geographic areas with rapidly changing environmental conditions merit re-verification on a more frequent basis.<sup>4</sup>

On January 18, 2023, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the Department of the Army ("the agencies") published the "Revised Definition of 'Waters of the United States,'" 88 FR 3004 (January 18, 2023) ("2023 Rule"). On September 8, 2023, the agencies published the "Revised Definition of 'Waters of the United States'; Conforming", which amended the 2023 Rule to conform to the 2023 Supreme Court decision in *Sackett v. EPA*, 598 U.S., 143 S. Ct. 1322 (2023) ("*Sackett*").

This Memorandum for Record (MFR) constitutes the basis of jurisdiction for a Corps AJD as defined in 33 CFR §331.2. For the purposes of this AJD, we have relied on Section 10 of the Rivers and Harbors Act of 1899 (RHA),<sup>5</sup> the 2023 Rule as amended,

Describe aquatic resources and features within the review area that were determined to be non-jurisdictional because they do not meet one or more categories of waters of the United States under the 2023 Rule as amended (e.g., tributaries that are non-relatively permanent waters; non-tidal wetlands that do not have a continuous surface connection to a jurisdictional water).

[Wetland 1 was identified in the November 2024 Heartland Wetland Determination \(preliminary field delineated wetlands\). Wetland 1 is not a TNW, territorial sea, or interstate water and therefore is not an \(a\)\(1\) water. Wetland 1 is a fresh \(wet\) meadow wetland located along the southern portion of the property and extends easterly outside of the review area towards a private driveway along Meadowview Road. The nearest relatively permanent water is an unnamed drainage ditch located approximately 1,300 lf to the east and south of Meadowview Road. Wetland 1 is physically separated from this unnamed ditch by the existing roadway and multiple private driveways, most of which do not contain any culverts. Based on our review of the November 2024 Heartland Wetland Determination, USGS topographic map, NHD layer, WDNR Surface Water Data Viewer, USDA Web Soil Survey, and Google Earth aerial imagery, we have determined that Wetland 1 lacks a continuous surface connection to a relatively permanent water. Wetland 1 does not physically abut a relatively permanent paragraph \(a\)\(2\) impoundment or a jurisdictional \(a\)\(3\) tributary. Wetland 1 is a non-tidal wetland that lacks a continuous surface connection to a relatively permanent water and as such does not meet the definition of adjacent and cannot be evaluated as an \(a\)\(4\) adjacent wetland; therefore, Wetland 1 is not jurisdictional under the 2023 Revised Definition of 'Waters of the United States'; Conforming" 88 FR 61964 Final Rule.](#)

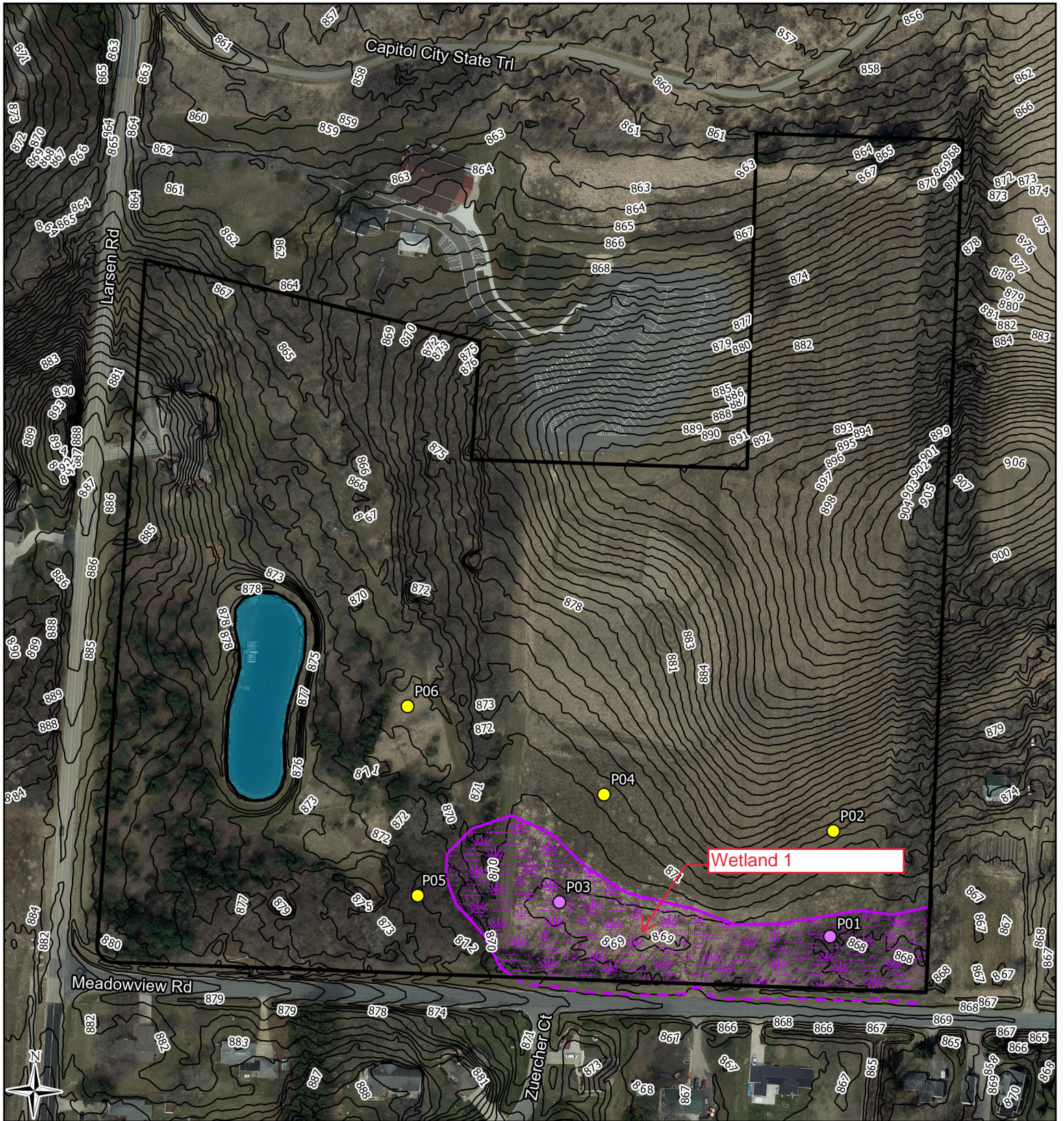

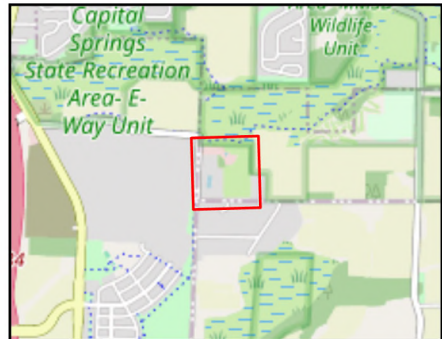

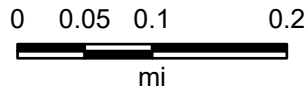
