1 Introduction

The master planning process recognizes the needs and desires of those persons or agencies associated with the affected Corp's facilities. Coordination and communication with these parties is an integral part of all Master Plans. The following documents the coordination efforts related to the Eau Galle Master Plan.

1.1 Congressional Notification

Congressional representatives from the area were notified of the update to the Master Plan in February 2018. Below is a list of representatives that received letters. Copies of the notification letters can be found at the end of this appendix.

1.2 Public Coordination

A public scoping meeting was held on 26 April, 2018 at the Spring Valley Emergency Services Center in Spring Valley, WI. The meeting was advertised via the Corps District webpage, a news release and flyers distributed at Eau Galle Recreation Area.

Comments received during the scoping phase of the Master Plan are included below. Comments focused on several themes:

- Trail System: Proper maintenance of trails, additional multi-use trails, additional connectivity.
- **Throughout the Project/Miscellaneous:** Make entire Project area smoke-free, offer additional programs by park rangers, provide additional trash cans, add a disc golf course, add primitive camping near the creek, add a dog park or designated dog area, build a waterslide down the dam, restroom upgrades, offer GPS programs, improve access throughout the Project (e.g., bridge from Northwest Day Use Area to Main Day Use Area), provide additional viewing platforms.
- Highland Ridge Campground: Make improvements (e.g., turning area, improved fire pits).
- Equestrian Campground: Make improvements (e.g., electricity, showers, potable water, additional parking, pens for horses).
- Environment/Natural Resources: Add fish cribs, provide invasive species control on land for plants (buckthorn, Tatarian honeysuckle, burdock, garlic mustard, Himalayan blackberry, creeping Charlie, and white sweet clover) and invertebrate animals (earthworms) and in the lake for fish (common carp), include storm water ponds, and balance recreation needs with the natural environment.
- Northwest Day Use Area: Offer kayak and canoes rentals ; add small boat launches, a fish cleaning station, a swimming platform, concessions, a disc golf course, and new and upgraded playground

equipment; improve the volleyball court; and build a basketball court.

• Lousy Creek Landing: Add a dock.

Material related to scoping and public engagement can be found at the end of this appendix. Additionally, comments received were transferred to maps of the project area. These potential improvements are shown in Plates 12 – 17 in Appendix B. These are ideas and concepts, and will not be implemented as part of the Master Plan. Rather these will be considered for implementation when the Operational Management Plan is completed.

The Draft Master Plan and Environmental Assessment was released for 30-day public review and comment (April 15 – May 17, 2019). The plan was posted on the Corps public website and a hard copy was available at the Spring Valley Public Library. One comment was received on the draft report and can be found at the end of this appendix.

1.3 Agency Coordination

An agency scoping was held on 26 April, 2018 at the Eau Galle Project Office in Spring Valley, WI. Below is a summary of the meeting.

Agencies that participated in the scoping meeting included:

- Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources
- Spring Valley Police Department
- St. Croix Birders
- St. Croix County
- Boy Scouts of St. Croix Valley

One comment from the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources was received related to improving the fish habitat via fish cribs, fish sticks or tree top drops.

The Wisconsin State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) was provided the Draft Master Plan and environmental assessment for comment. No concerns were raised by the SHPO office.

The Draft Master Plan and Environmental Assessment was released for 30-day public review and comment (April 15 – May 17, 2019). No comments from agencies were received.

1.4 Tribal Coordination

The Corps is responsible for consultation with federally recognized tribes that have historical and cultural associations within the Project area. In accordance with 36 CFR 800.3(f)(2) of the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation's regulation implementing Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966, the Corps identified 13 tribes as potentially having historical and cultural associations with the Project's geographic location. An official letter was mailed to the Tribal Historic Preservation Officers (THPO) on January 26, 2018 detailing the Master Plan and requesting tribal comments. Of these 13 THPOs, the Upper Sioux Community and Mille Lacs Band requested to be consulting parties. Information in connection with the Master Plan and environmental assessment continued to be provided to both Tribal communities. No concerns were raised by THPO offices.



Eau Galle Project Master Plan Revision

The Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) St. Paul District is revising the Eau Galle Project Master Plan. The plan, while conceptual in nature, will serve as the vision for both environmental stewardship and recreation as the Corps continues to serve the public in the 21st Century.

About the Eau Galle Project

The Eau Galle Project is located on the Eau Galle River in Spring Valley, WI. It was authorized by the Flood Control Act of 1958 as a result of repeated flooding in the Spring Valley area. The dam was built from 1965-1968 to serve as a flood control project (the reservoir is 640 acres). The reservoir and adjacent areas have been developed for recreational purposes and the conservation of fish and wildlife resources and habitat.

What is a Master Plan?

A Master Plan is a strategic land use and recreation management document that guides the comprehensive management and development of recreational, natural, and cultural resources throughout the life of a water resource project.

Why Revise the Eau Galle Master Plan?

The plan was last updated in 1990 and supplemented in 1999. The Plan is in need of revision to address changes to the environment, outdoor recreation trends and USACE management policy.

The primary goals of the plan include:

- Establish an overall land use management plan;
- Identify resource objectives; and
- Identify associated design and management concepts.

Developed by a Corps interagency team, the plan will include coordination with local, state and federal agencies and tribal representatives, along with input from the public.





Environmentally Sensitive Areas:

- Areas where scientific, ecological, cultural or aesthetic features have been identified. These areas must be considered by management to ensure the sensitive areas are not adversely impacted.









Water Surface:

Restricted

- Water areas restricted for project operations, safety, and security purposes.

Designated No-Wake

- To protect environmentally sensitive shoreline areas, recreational water access areas from disturbance, and for public safety.





Land Classification

Water Surface:

Fish and Wildlife Sanctuary

- Annual or seasonal restrictions on areas to protect fish and wildlife species during periods of migration, resting, feeding, nesting, and/or spawning.

Open Recreation

- Those waters available for year round or seasonal water-based recreational use.





Hi Brad,

Thanks for the maps! I've attached the bathymetric map with some recommended locations for fish cribs. Generally we place them in cluster of 8-10 cribs in depths ranging from 12-20 ft which makes them deep enough to not be an obstruction and shallow enough for anglers. I tried to avoid where I thought the channel flows through. The black spots are where I would recommend crib clusters, which would be around 50 cribs total. I would be more than happy to help with any other planning in the future with fish habitat! Also, regarding the water draw of the dam, are there plans for monitoring or changing the depth at which the water is drawn to allow for a more hypolimnetic draw which would decrease the water temp in the Eau Galle River below the dam to provide better thermal regimes for trout? The water temperatures sampled during our trend sampling each year seem to be warmer than in the past but that may be due to other factors as well. Just thought that I would check...







Hey there!

Just wanted to give some feedback - we recently stayed at Highland Ridge campground from July 16 - 27. The facilities are amazing. And the stay was good.

But I wanted to give some constructive criticism and ask for help for future disabled campers. My husband is disabled. We camp, even though there are days he requires a wheelchair to maneuver, because he loves it. We have permanent mobility license plates. For the entire time we were there, the ADA site was reserved and used by campers neither with disability plates or displayed disability placards. We were in site 7, with a very hard struggle up and down for his chair. I try to give the benefit of the doubt to campers in the ADA site, but I watched both of them ride by on unadapted bikes. As we pulled out, another camper set up in the ADA site, also not displaying any sort of disability tag. This makes it frustrating for those of us with mobility issues, especially when Your own regulations require those sites be reserved for campers with disabilities.

In addition, i asked the camp host for accommodations on helping my husband shower (he needs help with several adis) when we arrived and was told "why can't you do that in your camper - I guess if you have to, just put a sign on the bathroom door. But don't take too long." We camp a lot. We've asked for this accommodation before (especially when we don't have sever at the site), and this was the only time I've ever felt like I shouldn't have asked.

Lattended the open house earlier this summer to listen to other's comments and provide input. Laiso linked the notice seeking public input on the Spring Valley community facebook page and collected comments. Based on this I have this input to the comprehensive Plan-

The Eau Galle recreation is a wonderful park with a super staff. All that is there and what you do is appreciated. I grew up in the Ellsworth area and remember the park as the special place we went to at the end of the 4H year to celebrate. It is one of the few parks in Pierce County that offers trails, beaches, fishing, playgrounds and shelters. When looking for land to buy and build a house and farm I was hoping to find land near Spring Valley to be near this park. Now that our family is settled here we have enjoyed the park at parties, gone swimming on the hot days, stayed at the camp ground and enjoyed riding on the trails.

The park is a local gem.

Before we moved to this area we lived on the north side of the Twin Cities and Lenjoyed the forest near Hinkley and the Lake Elmo park preserve. They both offer riding trails and horse camping as well. If you are unfamiliar with their offerings I'd encourage the staff to visit those sites.

Trail riders tend to cover a lot of trail in a day. Likely at least 8 miles with the more adventurous and fit covering 12-15 miles. For a week-end full of riding about 25 miles would be best. If there is a way for Eau Galle to develop more miles of trails or link to trails outside the park to increase the miles of trails it would likely interest new and different riders.

While I have ridden a bit more aggressively in the past when enjoying the sport of eventing (a fast running and jumping sport) I would train in the Lake Elmo park preserve and take advantage of the good sandy soil and rolling terrain that I could gallop on. The wider trails with good visibility also helped when traveling at speed so the horse wouldn't spook at the sudden appearance of a fellow rider, biker or hiker. The trails in Eau Galle are quite rocky, hilly and have low visibility. More or different riders would be attracted by flatter terrain and wider trails. Some horses (and riders) wouldn't be able to ride the more challenging terrain in Eau Galle. You may want to check with the Mn Horse Council to understand what parks and types of trails are attracting the highest number of riders. When I visited them it seemed that many trail ridersliked the wider, flatter and less challenging trails. These also favor young and old riders and riding in friend or family groups:

For horse trails to be shared they must be wide enough and provide enough visibility that the horse can see the approaching party and they can see the horse from a good distance. Reople unfamiliar with horses are totally unaware of what spooks a horse and creates a dangerous situation. Shiny, flashy or loud objects will spook them as well as reaching out to them as they pass or running at them. Establishing trail rules for safety is very important. The current trails are not likely a good shared trail option as the ones I am thinking of are quite hilly, narrow with no long sight lines.

If there is a way to add more miles of trails that are wider and flatter they would likely attract new riders and with enough miles to fill a weekend they may utilize the equestrian camping option which few parks offer.

Comments regarding other park features-

A fishing dock that could be walked to from the camping area would be great

1

A platform to swim to and jump from at the beach would be wonderful and maybe keep kids from climbing on the floating barriers

A dog park area would be a nice addition and they are now very popular near the cities

Private showers at the beach to wash off well

A trail connecting Spring Valley with the park would allow local youth and families to enjoy the beach, fishing and trails without having to drive a car in so they would likely visit much more frequently. A trailway that is bike/stroller/wagon friendly would be great.

These are condensed from the comments made to my FB post. People think the park is great but also seem unaware of all that it offers. While I know that the park can't officially "advertise" it would be great if there was more awareness of the shelters, trails and amenities you do have as people were suggesting things that you already have ;-O if you can't directly advertise it seems that a "friends of Eau Galle" group could help promote the park with you. Thanks for this opportunity and avenue to provide comments and suggestions.

Also if there was some type of regular bathroom/shower facilities there in the center that would be ideal. The port a potty's there now are very unclean and often too full of waste. You can't even breath in there when you have to use them. It's like the worst part of the whole park is the port a potty situation. Not just at horse camp but everywhere. I would rather go in the woods then use those.

Also this is a very tall order, but in the horse camp area, it would be sooooo wonderful to have small individual pens for the horses instead of hi ties. Horses get tangled in those overnight and wrapped around the other side and some freak out. Maybe not at all the sites but half would be awesome.

1. **Project Proponent.** St. Paul District, Corps of Engineers, 180 Fifth Street East, Suite 700, St. Paul, Minnesota 55101-1678.

2. **Project Authority.** The proposed actions were authorized under the authority of the Flood Control Act of 1958 (Public Law 85-500).




Figure 1. Eau Galle Project Area.

3. **Project Location.** The proposed action would be located in Pierce and St. Croix Counties, Wisconsin (Figure 1).

4. **Summary of the Proposed Project.** The Eau Galle Project Master Plan is a strategic land-use document that will serve as a vital tool for the responsible stewardship of resources to benefit present and future generations. This plan provides guidance and facilitates appropriate management, use, development, enhancement, protection, and conservation of the natural, cultural, and man-made resources located at the Eau Galle Project. This document will guide and articulate the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers' responsibilities pursuant to applicable federal laws, policies, and regulations. The Master Plan is a dynamic, operational document projecting what could and should happen over the life of the project and is flexible based upon changing conditions. The Master Plan deals with concepts, rather than details of design or administration. Detailed management and administrative functions are addressed in each section's operational management plan, which implements the concepts of the Master Plan into operational actions.

The Master Plan is being developed by an interdisciplinary Corps' team and considers coordination with local, state, federal agencies and tribal representatives. By definition, Master Plans for Corps reservoirs are land and recreational use management plans that do not address the technical aspects of water level management, water quality, shoreline management, or operation and maintenance of project operations facilities. To ensure consideration of natural and cultural resources, the Corps also prepared an Environmental Assessment (EA) to identify and evaluate potential impacts. The previous Eau Galle Project Master Plan was approved in 1990. A supplement to the plan was completed in 1999.

5. Coordination.

a. <u>General</u>. By way of this public review process, the proposed action is being coordinated with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources and local agencies. Coordination occurred with the Tribal Historic Preservation Office for 13 tribes.

b. <u>Federal</u>. A Draft Environmental Assessment and Finding of No Significant Impact has been prepared and is being coordinated in accordance with the National Environmental Policy Act. Coordination with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service will occur by way of this review process.

6. **Summary of Environmental Impacts.** Use of the revised Master Plan would help define the approval process for future actions affecting project lands. For specific actions that are identified in the Master Plan, the approval process would still require adequate NEPA consideration prior to initiating construction.

Because of the wide variety of possible future management recommendations or tasks that could be proposed, an additional evaluation to determine consistency with the stated site objectives and further NEPA consideration would be required as these tasks are undertaken.

The implementation of the Master Plan would not result in any irreversible environmental conditions. The Master Plan is a land-use planning document intended to benefit productivity of land at Eau Galle in the long-term. While any future maintenance and construction activities may temporarily disrupt wildlife and human use in project areas, negative long-term impacts are expected to be minimal or non-existent on all ecosystems associated with the Master Plan.

7. **Report.** The draft report and environmental assessment that describes the project and the environmental impacts in detail is available to the public and can be viewed at https://www.mvp.usace.army.mil/EauGalleMasterPlan/.

8. **Review and Comment.** Any comments on the Draft Report and Environmental Assessment should be provided before the expiration date of this notice. Persons submitting comments are advised that all comments received will be available for public review, to include the possibility of posting on a public website.
