There are no "navigable waters of the U.S." within Rivers and Harbors Act (RHA) jurisdiction (as defined by 33 CFR part 329) in the review area.

 - Potentially jurisdictional waters and/or wetlands were assessed within the review area and determined to be not jurisdictional. Explain: The review area contains three intrastate wetlands, labeled Wetland A (3.71 acres), Wetland B (0.17 ac), and Wetland C (0.08 ac). These wetlands are isolated, per review of the July 2021 wetland delineation report which included a topographic map, NRCS web soil survey, Wisconsin Wetland Inventory, historic aerial photos, and ground level site photos. Wetlands A and C continue outside of the delineated area so those areas were reviewed in detail. Wetland A is constrained to the north and west by delineated upland, to the east by commercial and residential development, and to the south by Sunset Road, where there are no culverts or other connections that provide a surface or subsurface flow path to a downstream water. Wetland C is part of a larger wetland to the southwest that continues to Sunset Road. A portion of the wetland is south of Sunset Road as well; however, based on aerial photos this entire wetland does not include any inlets/outlets or other surface or shallow subsurface connections to a downstream water. The nearest tributary to any of these three wetlands is unnamed to Lake Michigan, approximately 4,400 feet to the east of Wetland A.

The wetlands do not border, are not neighboring to or contiguous with another water of the US. They are not separated from another water of the US by man-made barriers, dikes, or berms. Due to existing and surrounding land use (agriculture, commercial, and residential development) and proximity to other waters, there are no ecological connections to other wetlands or waters. These aquatic resources do not support a link to interstate or foreign commerce; are not known to be used by interstate or foreign travelers for recreation or other purposes; do not produce fish or shellfish that could be taken and sold in interstate or foreign commerce; and are not known to be used for industrial purposes by industries in interstate commerce. Therefore, the Corps has determined that Wetlands A, B, and C are not regulated by the Corps under Section 404 of the Clean Water Act.
