- ☒ The review area is comprised entirely of dry land (i.e., there are no waters or water features, including wetlands, of any kind in the entire review area). Rationale: The review area includes a parcel measuring approximately 4.08 acres located in the city of Wabasha, Minnesota. The National Wetlands Inventory (NWI) indicates no wetland areas as being mapped within the survey area and the MN DNR Public Waters Inventory Map indicates there are no public waters within the survey area. The USGS Topographic Map and National Hydrography Dataset (NHD) do not indicate any wetlands, watercourses, or other waterbodies within the review area. The Wabasha County Soil Survey indicates a lack of hydric soils in the review area. Aerial photographs from the following years: 1992, 2003, 2004, 2005, 2006, 2008, 2009, 2010, 2011, and 2015 were reviewed and showed a lack of wetland signatures within the review area.
