This application is being reviewed in accordance with the practices for documenting Corps jurisdiction under Sections 9 & 10 of the Rivers and Harbors Act of 1899 and Section 404 of the Clean Water Act identified in Regulatory Guidance Letter 16-01.

**PROJECT DESCRIPTION AND PURPOSE:** The applicant is applying for a Department of the Army permit to dredge material and add 14 boat slips to the north side of Pier 5 at the Port Washington Marina. The project would dredge approximately 3,500 cubic yards to an average water depth of 8 feet. The area of dredging would be approximately 75 feet by 287 feet and would be at least 20 feet away from the existing breakwater. Dredging would be completed by barge with mechanical equipment. There would be no discharge of dredged material back into Lake Michigan (material would be trucked to a landfill). The finger piers would be constructed from galvanized steel, floated in place, and bolted to the existing pier. The additional boat slips would be 27 feet by 30 feet in size. There would be no discharge of fill material into Lake Michigan associated with the pier addition.

NAME, AREA AND TYPES OF WATERS (INCLUDING WETLANDS) SUBJECT TO LOSS:


The proposed project would not result in the discharge of dredged or fill material into waters of the U.S. Upland areas would be converted to aquatic lakebed through excavation of uplands currently above water level. The existing lakebed would have a change in bottom elevation.

**COMPENSATORY MITIGATION:** The applicant has not proposed any compensatory mitigation because there would not be a permanent loss of waters of the U.S.
