MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD

SUBJECT: US Army Corps of Engineers (Corps) Approved Jurisdictional Determination in accordance with the "Revised Definition of 'Waters of the United States'"; (88 FR 3004 (January 18, 2023) as amended by the "Revised Definition of 'Waters of the United States'; Conforming" (8 September 2023), 1 [2016-03845-EJI MFR 1 of 1]²

BACKGROUND. An Approved Jurisdictional Determination (AJD) is a Corps document stating the presence or absence of waters of the United States on a parcel or a written statement and map identifying the limits of waters of the United States on a parcel. AJDs are clearly designated appealable actions and will include a basis of JD with the document.³ AJDs are case-specific and are typically made in response to a request. AJDs are valid for a period of five years unless new information warrants revision of the determination before the expiration date or a District Engineer has identified, after public notice and comment, that specific geographic areas with rapidly changing environmental conditions merit re-verification on a more frequent basis.⁴

On January 18, 2023, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the Department of the Army ("the agencies") published the "Revised Definition of 'Waters of the United States," 88 FR 3004 (January 18, 2023) ("2023 Rule"). On September 8, 2023, the agencies published the "Revised Definition of 'Waters of the United States'; Conforming", which amended the 2023 Rule to conform to the 2023 Supreme Court decision in *Sackett v. EPA*, 598 U.S., 143 S. Ct. 1322 (2023) ("*Sackett*").

This Memorandum for Record (MFR) constitutes the basis of jurisdiction for a Corps AJD as defined in 33 CFR §331.2. For the purposes of this AJD, we have relied on Section 10 of the Rivers and Harbors Act of 1899 (RHA),⁵ the 2023 Rule as amended,

- 3. REVIEW AREA. The review area encompasses approximately 44 acres and is identified by the red polygon on the attached figure labeled MVP-2016-03845-EJI Page 2 of 2. The review area is located at Latitude: 44.866029, Longitude: -93.340812, in the City of Edina, Hennepin County, Minnesota. There are no other JDs associated with this review area.

- 4. NEAREST TRADITIONAL NAVIGABLE WATER (TNW), THE TERRITORIAL SEAS, OR INTERSTATE WATER TO WHICH THE AQUATIC RESOURCE IS CONNECTED. The wetlands within the review area are connected to the Minnesota River which is listed as a Navigable Water of the United States in Minnesota.⁶
- 5. FLOWPATH FROM THE SUBJECT AQUATIC RESOURCES TO A TNW, THE TERRITORIAL SEAS, OR INTERSTATE WATER. The wetlands in the review area flow into the City of Edina's storm sewer system which is connected to Nine Mile Creek by approximately 0.50 miles of subsurface storm sewer pipes. Nine Mile Creek flows into the Minnesota River approximately 8 river miles south of the review area.

A stand-alone TNW determination is conducted for a specific segment of river or stream or other type of waterbody, such as a lake, where upstream or downstream limits or lake borders are established.

8. NON-JURISDICTIONAL AQUATIC RESOURCES AND FEATURES

Wetlands 1 through 11 are not TNWs, territorial seas, or interstate waters and therefore are not (a)(1) waters. A site visit conducted on January 30, 2024, topographic maps, and Google Earth aerial imagery indicate that wetlands 1 through 11 are depressional wetlands, surrounded by upland. These wetlands do not physically abut a relatively permanent paragraph (a)(2) impoundment or a jurisdictional (a)(3) tributary and are not separated from a jurisdictional water by a natural berm, bank, dune, or similar natural landform. These wetlands are approximately 0.50 miles east of the closest tributary (Nine Mile Creek). Wetlands within the review area flow into the City of Edina's municipal storm sewer system, which is connected to Nine Mile Creek through approximately

0.50 miles of subsurface storm sewer pipe. Consistent with the joint policy memo (Memorandum on NWP-2023-602) issued by the Department of the Army and the EPA regarding whether subsurface flow through a municipal storm sewer system qualifies as flow through a discrete feature that can serve as a continuous surface connection, we have determined that subsurface flow through 0.50 miles of the City of Edina's underground storm sewer system does not qualify as flow through a discrete feature that can serve as a continuous surface connection. These wetlands are non-tidal wetlands that do not have a continuous surface connection to a relatively permanent jurisdictional water and as such do not meet the definition of adjacent and cannot be evaluated as (a)(4) adjacent wetlands; therefore, these wetlands are not jurisdictional under the 2023 Revised Definition of 'Waters of the United States'; Conforming" 88 FR 61964 Final Rule.




Figure 2. The Study Area is near the southern border of Edina in Hennepin County.




Figure G. Updated Action of The light blue lines indicate where the 2006 defined in ordination.
