This letter contains an Approved Jurisdictional Determination (AJD) for the area(s) identified below, located on the 133rd Airlift ANGS in Section 29, Township 28 North, Range 23 West, Hennepin County, Minnesota. The review area for this determination is identified on the enclosed figures labeled: MVP-2025-01075-TJH Figure 1 of 3 through 3 of 3.

Non-Jurisdictional Area(s):

We have determined that the following area(s) are not waters of the United States subject to Corps of Engineers (Corps) jurisdiction under Section 404 of the Clean Water Act or Sections 9 or 10 of the Rivers and Harbors Act:

- Wetland 1, (0.05 acre)

You are not required to obtain Corps authorization within the area(s) listed above. This determination only applies to the area(s) identified above and is based on a reasonable approximation of their location and boundaries. The basis for this determination is provided in the enclosed Memorandum for Record.

Appeal Process:

If you object to this approved jurisdictional determination, you may request an administrative appeal under Corps regulations at 33 CFR 331. Enclosed you will find a Notification of Appeal Process (NAP) fact sheet and Request for Appeal (RFA) form. If you request to appeal this determination, you must submit a completed RFA form to the Mississippi Valley Division Office at the address shown on the form. In order for an RFA to be accepted by the Corps, the Corps must determine that it is complete, that it meets the criteria for appeal under 33 CFR 331.5, and that it has been received by the Division Office within 60 days of the date of the enclosed NAP.

It is not necessary to submit an RFA form to the division office if you do not object to the determination in this letter.

AJD Expiration:

This AJD may be relied upon for five years from the date of this letter. However, the Corps reserves the right to review and revise the determination in response to information that was not considered during our initial review.

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MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD

SUBJECT: US Army Corps of Engineers (Corps) Approved Jurisdictional Determination in accordance with the "Revised Definition of 'Waters of the United States'"; (88 FR 3004 (January 18, 2023) as amended by the "Revised Definition of 'Waters of the United States'; Conforming" (8 September 2023) ,¹ MVP-2025-01075-TJH [[MFR 1 of 1](#)]²

BACKGROUND. An Approved Jurisdictional Determination (AJD) is a Corps document stating the presence or absence of waters of the United States on a parcel or a written statement and map identifying the limits of waters of the United States on a parcel. AJDs are clearly designated appealable actions and will include a basis of JD with the document.³ AJDs are case-specific and are typically made in response to a request. AJDs are valid for a period of five years unless new information warrants revision of the determination before the expiration date or a District Engineer has identified, after public notice and comment, that specific geographic areas with rapidly changing environmental conditions merit re-verification on a more frequent basis.⁴

On January 18, 2023, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the Department of the Army ("the agencies") published the "Revised Definition of 'Waters of the United States,'" 88 FR 3004 (January 18, 2023) ("2023 Rule"). On September 8, 2023, the agencies published the "Revised Definition of 'Waters of the United States'; Conforming", which amended the 2023 Rule to conform to the 2023 Supreme Court decision in *Sackett v. EPA*, 598 U.S., 143 S. Ct. 1322 (2023) ("*Sackett*").

This Memorandum for Record (MFR) constitutes the basis of jurisdiction for a Corps AJD as defined in 33 CFR §331.2. For the purposes of this AJD, we have relied on Section 10 of the Rivers and Harbors Act of 1899 (RHA),⁵ the 2023 Rule as amended, as well as other applicable guidance, relevant case law, and longstanding practice in evaluating jurisdiction.

¹ While the Revised Definition of "Waters of the United States"; Conforming had no effect on some categories of waters covered under the CWA, and no effect on any waters covered under RHA, all categories are included in this Memorandum for Record for efficiency.

² When documenting aquatic resources within the review area that are jurisdictional under the Clean Water Act (CWA), use an additional MFR and group the aquatic resources on each MFR based on the TNW, the territorial seas, or interstate water that they are connected to. The review area for this determination includes one non-jurisdictional ditch labeled Wetland 1 on the attached figures labeled 2025-01075-TJH Figures 1 of 3 through 3 of 3. The review area is surrounded by development located on the 133rd Airlift Wing ANG Base, located in Section 29, Township 28 North, Range 23 West, Hennepin County, Minnesota. The approximate center coordinates of the site (in decimal degrees) are Latitude: 44.890757, Longitude: -93.203810. There are no other JDs associated with this review area.

Wetland 1 is a man-made rain garden/biowswale constructed in August of 2008 according to the site environmental manager. Wetland 1 was constructed in upland based on review of the wetland delineation report and desktop resources including US Geological Service 3DEP Hillshade and DEM maps; MNDNR 2-foot contour maps; MNDNR NWI Wetland Finder/NWI maps; NHD data; and NRCS hydric soil data; and aerial imagery from Google Earth Pro. Recent aerial photos do not show relatively permanent flow. Based on the wetland delineation and desktop resources reviewed, this aquatic resource was excavated wholly in and draining only uplands and does not carry a relatively permanent flow and, according to exclusion (b)(3) of the 2023 Rule, as amended, is not a water of the United States.

Figure 5. Wetland Delineation Overview Map

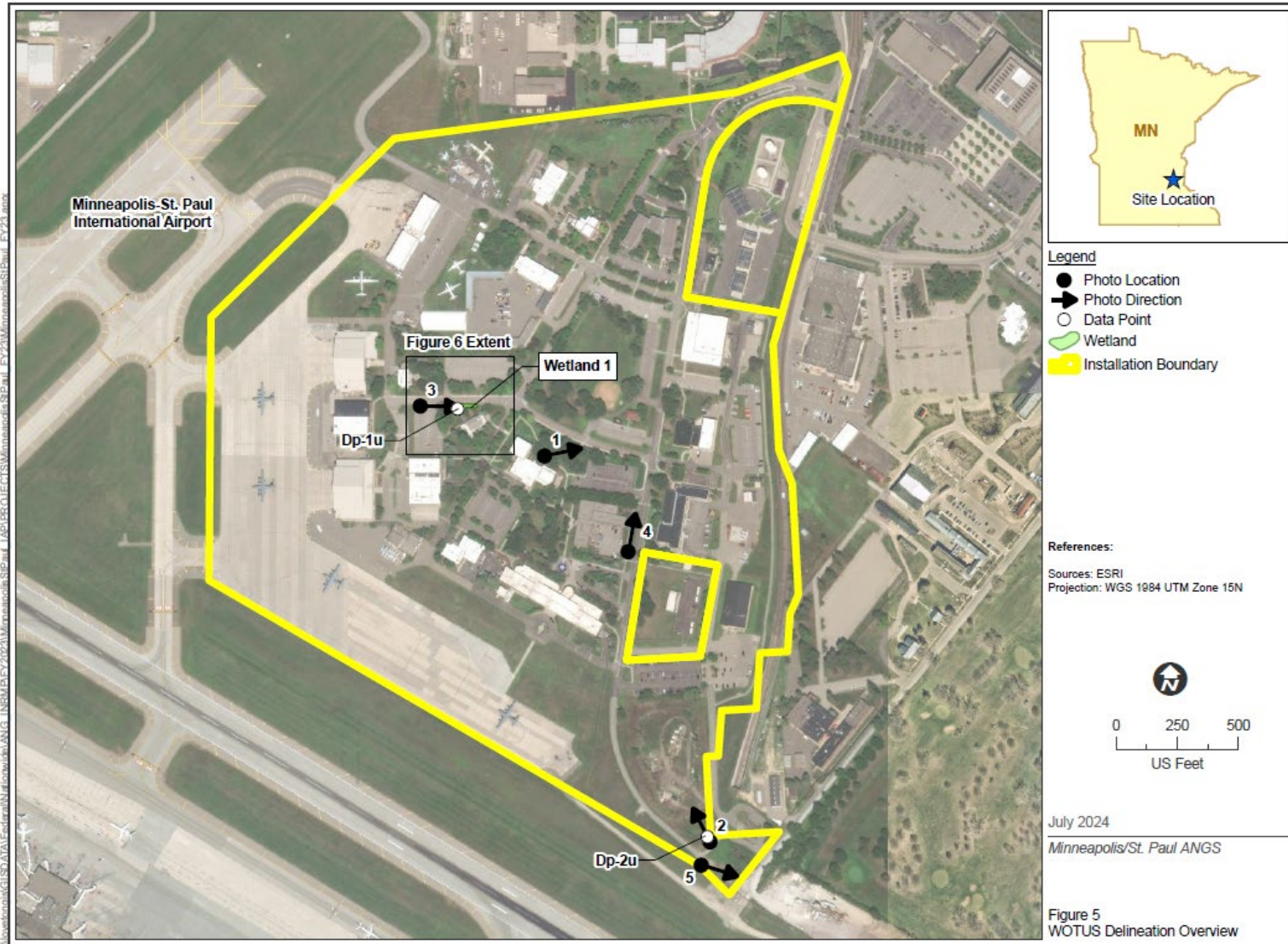


Figure 6. Wetland 1
