MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD

SUBJECT: US Army Corps of Engineers (Corps) Approved Jurisdictional Determination in accordance with the "Revised Definition of 'Waters of the United States'"; (88 FR 3004 (January 18, 2023) as amended by the "Revised Definition of 'Waters of the United States'; Conforming" (8 September 2023)).¹ 2016-02431-RJH (MFR 1 of 1)

BACKGROUND. An Approved Jurisdictional Determination (AJD) is a Corps document stating the presence or absence of waters of the United States on a parcel or a written statement and map identifying the limits of waters of the United States on a parcel. AJDs are clearly designated appealable actions and will include a basis of JD with the document.² AJDs are case-specific and are typically made in response to a request. AJDs are valid for a period of five years unless new information warrants revision of the determination before the expiration date or a District Engineer has identified, after public notice and comment, that specific geographic areas with rapidly changing environmental conditions merit re-verification on a more frequent basis.³

On January 18, 2023, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the Department of the Army ("the agencies") published the "Revised Definition of 'Waters of the United States,'" 88 FR 3004 (January 18, 2023) ("2023 Rule"). On September 8, 2023, the agencies published the "Revised Definition of 'Waters of the United States'; Conforming", which amended the 2023 Rule to conform to the 2023 Supreme Court decision in *Sackett v. EPA*, 598 U.S., 143 S. Ct. 1322 (2023) ("*Sackett*").

This Memorandum for Record (MFR) constitutes the basis of jurisdiction for a Corps AJD as defined in 33 CFR §331.2. For the purposes of this AJD, we have relied on Section 10 of the Rivers and Harbors Act of 1899 (RHA),⁴ the 2023 Rule as amended, as well as other applicable guidance, relevant case law, and longstanding practice in evaluating jurisdiction.

Wetland 1 is a 0.49-acre wet meadow type wetland located within a closed depression. The wetland is surrounded by a Feed Storage Area (FSA) to the south and east, Leachate Basin to the north, and storm water basin to the west. Prior to being surrounded by dairy production site this area was a wooded area with no indication of being a wetland, including in the original land survey, Bordner Survey, or 1938 air photo. The Digital Elevation Model layer of the National Regulatory Viewer shows that this wetland feature does not have any discrete or confined conveyance features.

Wetlands 1 is not a TNW, territorial sea, or interstate waters and therefore is not (a)(1) waters. The wetland is depressional, surrounded by uplands. The wetland does not extend to any tributaries and is not drained by any discrete/confined surface water conveyances. The wetland does not physically abut a relatively permanent paragraph (a)(2) impoundment or a jurisdictional (a)(3) tributary and is not separated from a jurisdictional water by a natural berm, bank, dune, or similar natural landform.

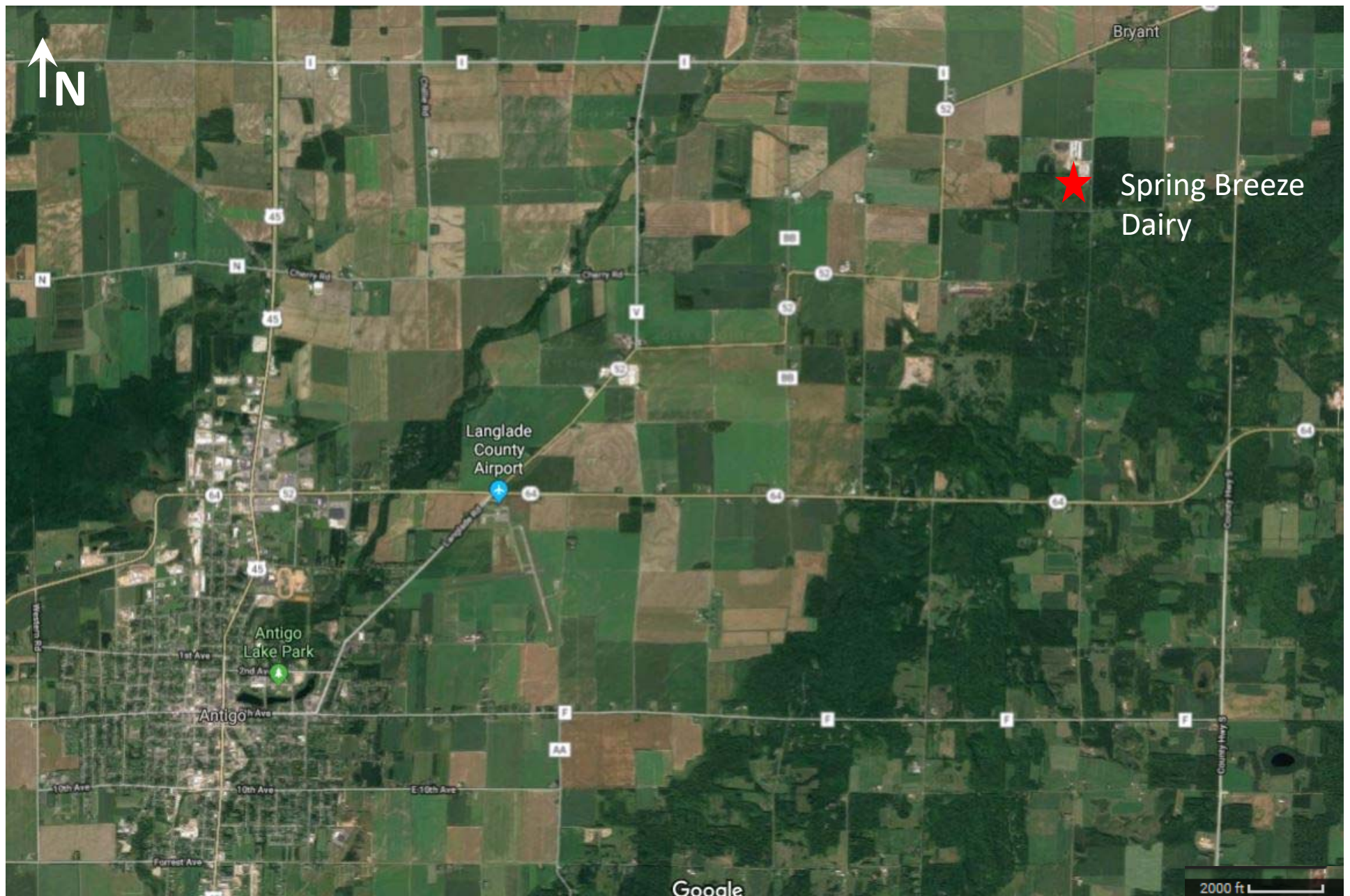
Wetland 1 is approximately 0.75 miles south of an unnamed tributary to Spring Brook. There are no ditches, swales, pipes, or culverts present with in the wetland that connects to downstream jurisdictional waters. Wetland 1 is a non-tidal wetland that does not have a discrete continuous surface water connection to a relatively permanent jurisdictional water and as such does not meet the definition of adjacent and cannot be evaluated as (a)(4) adjacent wetlands; therefore, Wetland 1 is not jurisdictional under the 2023 Revised Definition of ‘Waters of the United States’; Conforming” 88 FR 61964 Final Rule.

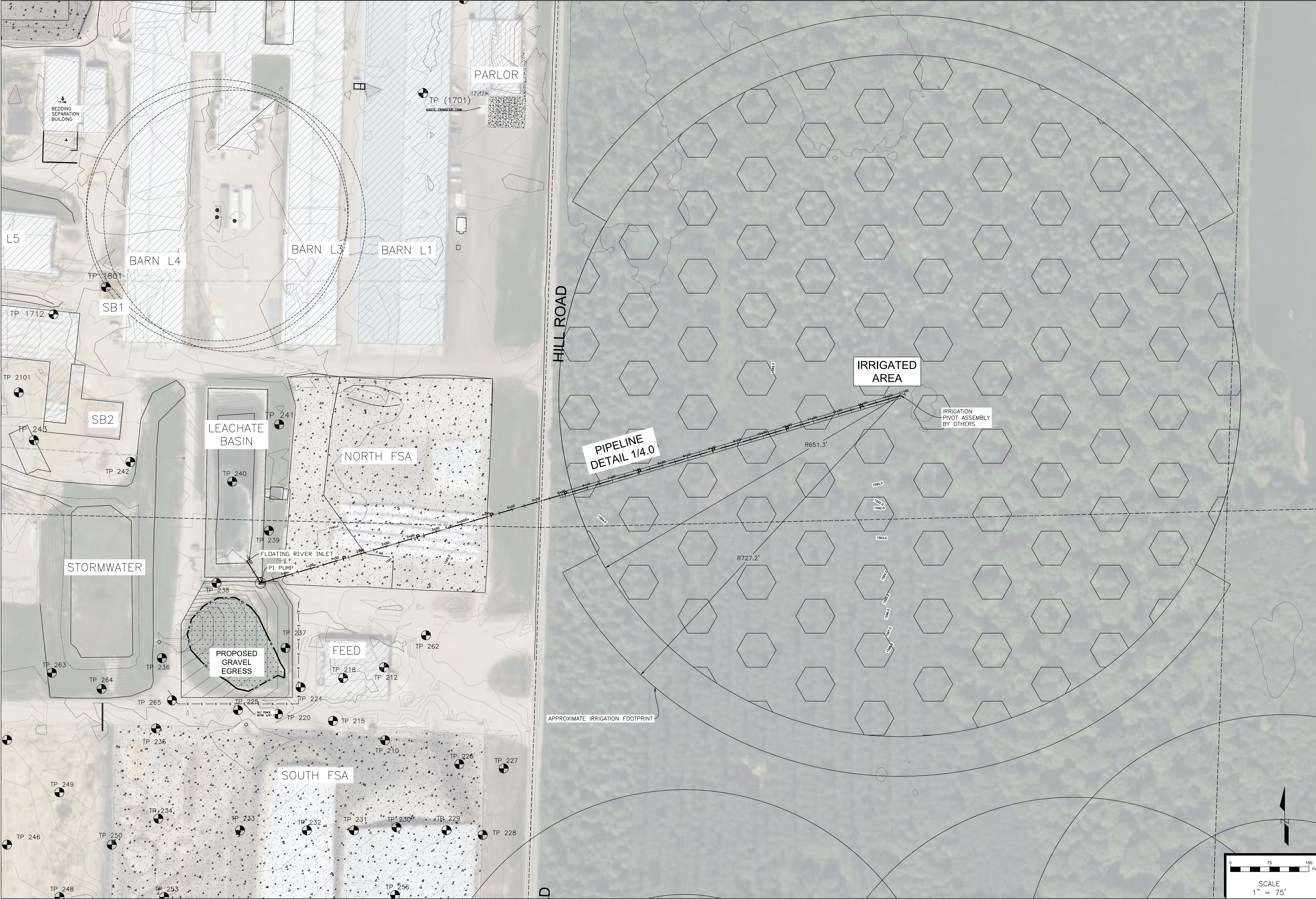
