MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD

SUBJECT: US Army Corps of Engineers (Corps) Approved Jurisdictional Determination in accordance with the "Revised Definition of 'Waters of the United States'"; (88 FR 3004 (January 18, 2023) as amended by the "Revised Definition of 'Waters of the United States'; Conforming" (8 September 2023) ,¹ MVP-2022-00962-LAH MFR 1 of 1

BACKGROUND. An Approved Jurisdictional Determination (AJD) is a Corps document stating the presence or absence of waters of the United States on a parcel or a written statement and map identifying the limits of waters of the United States on a parcel. AJDs are clearly designated appealable actions and will include a basis of JD with the document.² AJDs are case-specific and are typically made in response to a request. AJDs are valid for a period of five years unless new information warrants revision of the determination before the expiration date or a District Engineer has identified, after public notice and comment, that specific geographic areas with rapidly changing environmental conditions merit re-verification on a more frequent basis.³

On January 18, 2023, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the Department of the Army ("the agencies") published the "Revised Definition of 'Waters of the United States,'" 88 FR 3004 (January 18, 2023) ("2023 Rule"). On September 8, 2023, the agencies published the "Revised Definition of 'Waters of the United States'; Conforming", which amended the 2023 Rule to conform to the 2023 Supreme Court decision in *Sackett v. EPA*, 598 U.S., 143 S. Ct. 1322 (2023) ("*Sackett*").

This Memorandum for Record (MFR) constitutes the basis of jurisdiction for a Corps AJD as defined in 33 CFR §331.2. For the purposes of this AJD, we have relied on Section 10 of the Rivers and Harbors Act of 1899 (RHA),⁴ the 2023 Rule as amended, as well as other applicable guidance, relevant case law, and longstanding practice in evaluating jurisdiction.

3. REVIEW AREA. The review area is approximately 0.5 acre in size and is identified by the blue polygon in the attached 2022-00962-LAH Figures 1 of 2 through 2 of 2. The review area is located at 44.442399, -88.144743 in the Village of Hobart, Brown County, Wisconsin. An additional JD reviewed by the Corps in 2022 where these wetlands (Wetland 6 and Wetland 8) were not included in that determination.

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within the review area and describe how it was determined to meet one of the exclusions listed in 33 CFR 328.3(b).⁷ N/A

- b. Describe aquatic resources and features within the review area that were determined to be non-jurisdictional because they do not meet one or more categories of waters of the United States under the 2023 Rule as amended (e.g., tributaries that are non-relatively permanent waters; non-tidal wetlands that do not have a continuous surface connection to a jurisdictional water).

Wetland 6 and Wetland 8 are not TNWs, territorial seas, or interstate waters, and therefore are not (a)(1) waters. A review of topographic maps, Google Earth aerial and ground view imagery, delineation report, and Digital Elevation Model and Hillshade accessed from Mississippi Valley Division NRV indicate that these wetlands are depressional wetlands, surrounded entirely by upland. The review area is comprised of agricultural field with a forested area to the south and agricultural fields to the north, west, and south. Orlando Drive borders the parcel to the north and South Pine Tree Road borders to the west. To the east of the review area, a residential subdivision abuts Wetland 6. In the delineation report, general drainage of the review area funnels toward a northern and southern stream through agricultural drainage features. These wetlands do not physically abut a relatively permanent paragraph (a)(2) impoundment or a jurisdictional (a)(3) tributary and are not separated from a jurisdictional water by a natural berm, bank, dune, or similar natural landform. There is an unnamed tributary of the Ashwaubenon Creek located approximately 600 feet to the south and an unnamed tributary of the Dutchman Creek located approximately 1,000 feet to the north of the review area, and the resources listed above do not maintain a continuous surface connection to these jurisdictional waters.

Wetland 6 is located on the eastern boundary and Wetland 8 is located on the western boundary of the area of interest encompassing both review areas. They are both situated within the actively farmed field. These topographically low areas within the field show no discrete or confined outlets, which would serve as a continuous surface connection to a downstream TNW. As a result, it has been concluded that there are no continuous surface connections of these wetlands to downstream jurisdictional waters.

Wetland 6 and Wetland 8 contain no ditches, swales, pipes, or culverts that connect these wetlands to downstream jurisdictional waters. It was considered that Wetland 8 is within close proximity to South Pine Tree Road. However, there are no confined connections to the ditch running along this roadway. These

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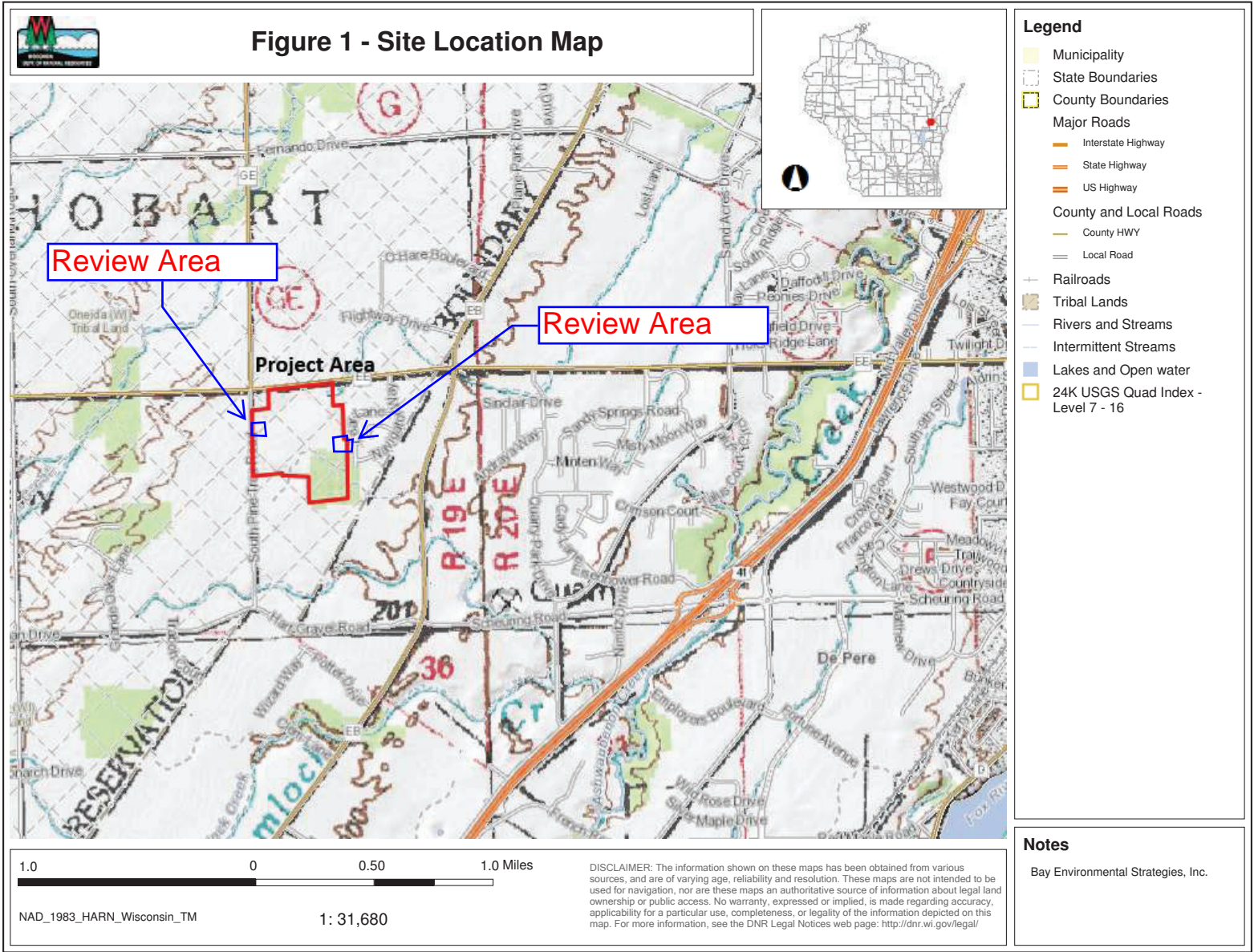
wetlands are non-tidal wetlands that do not have a continuous surface connection to a relatively permanent jurisdictional water and as such do not meet the definition of adjacent and cannot be evaluated as (a)(4) adjacent wetlands. Therefore, these wetlands are not jurisdictional under the 2023 Revised Definition of "Waters of the United States" Conforming 88 FR 61964 Final Rule.
