MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD

SUBJECT: US Army Corps of Engineers (Corps) Approved Jurisdictional Determination in accordance with the “Revised Definition of ‘Waters of the United States’”; (88 FR 3004 (January 18, 2023) as amended by the “Revised Definition of ‘Waters of the United States’; Conforming” (8 September 2023) ,¹ MVP-2025-01017-JLK [MFR 1 of 1]²

BACKGROUND. An Approved Jurisdictional Determination (AJD) is a Corps document stating the presence or absence of waters of the United States on a parcel or a written statement and map identifying the limits of waters of the United States on a parcel. AJDs are clearly designated appealable actions and will include a basis of JD with the document.³ AJDs are case-specific and are typically made in response to a request. AJDs are valid for a period of five years unless new information warrants revision of the determination before the expiration date or a District Engineer has identified, after public notice and comment, that specific geographic areas with rapidly changing environmental conditions merit re-verification on a more frequent basis.⁴

On January 18, 2023, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the Department of the Army (“the agencies”) published the “Revised Definition of ‘Waters of the United States,’” 88 FR 3004 (January 18, 2023) (“2023 Rule”). On September 8, 2023, the agencies published the “Revised Definition of ‘Waters of the United States’; Conforming”, which amended the 2023 Rule to conform to the 2023 Supreme Court decision in *Sackett v. EPA*, 598 U.S., 143 S. Ct. 1322 (2023) (“*Sackett*”).

This Memorandum for Record (MFR) constitutes the basis of jurisdiction for a Corps AJD as defined in 33 CFR §331.2. For the purposes of this AJD, we have relied on Section 10 of the Rivers and Harbors Act of 1899 (RHA),⁵ the 2023 Rule as amended,

Wetland 1 is not a TNW, territorial sea, or interstate water and therefore is not an (a)(1) water. Topographic maps, Google Earth Pro aerial imagery, and site photos provided in the delineation report, indicate this wetland is a depressional wetland located in the central portion of the review area. Wetland 1 is surrounded by uplands involving an agricultural field in all directions with a forested area further north and east and Ashwaubenon Creek approximately 580 feet further east. A review of Lidar data shows a shallow ditch-like feature near the wetland extending approximately 60 linear feet northeast towards the forested area. However, a review of site level photos and the delineation report demonstrate the area immediately northeast of Wetland 1 transitions to uplands involving the agricultural field and forested area further east. Wetland 1 does not physically abut a relatively permanent paragraph (a)(2) impoundment or a jurisdictional (a)(3) tributary. Therefore, Wetland 1 is not jurisdictional under the 2023 Revised Definition of “Waters of the United States”: Conforming” 88 FR 61964 Final Rule.

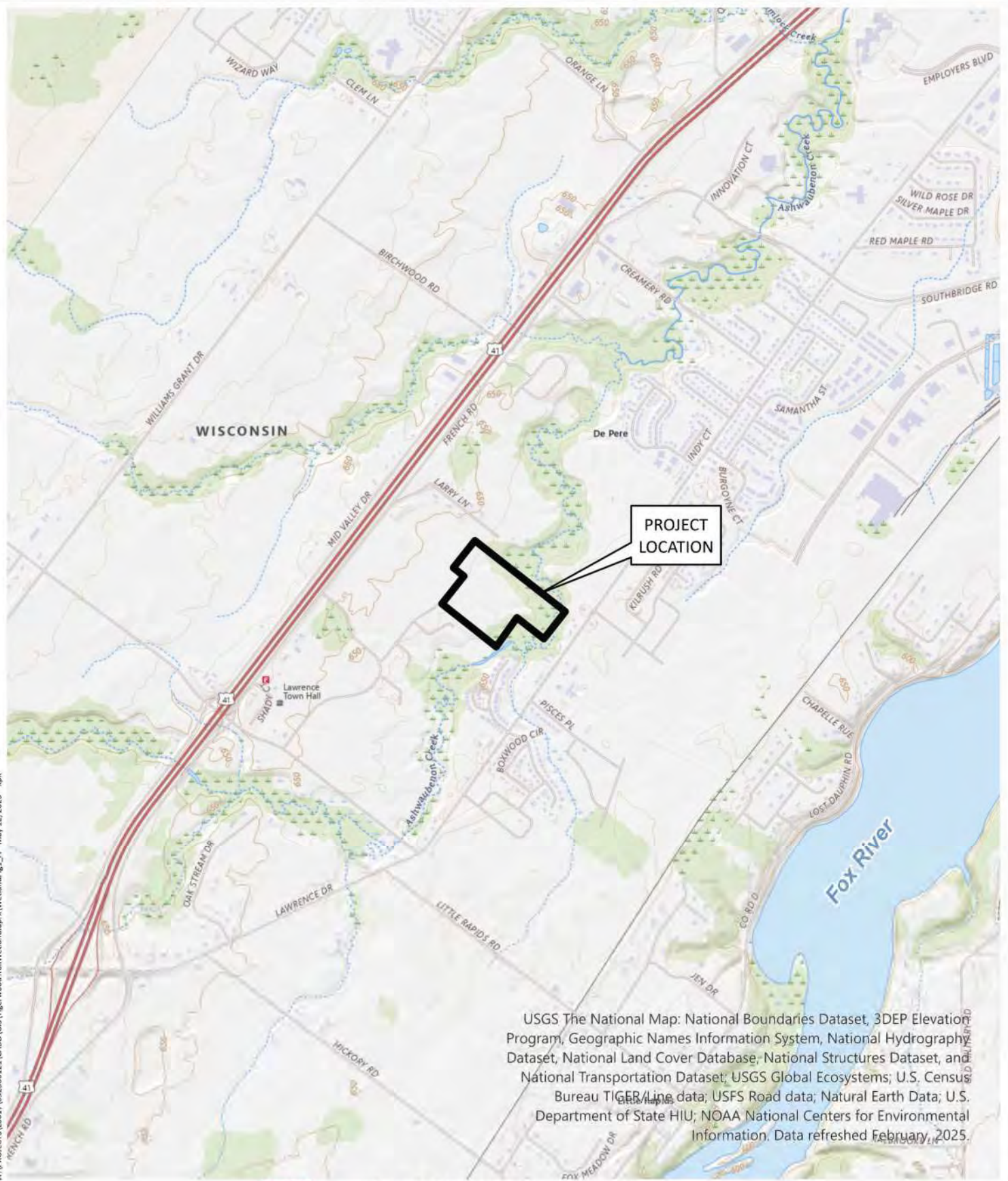

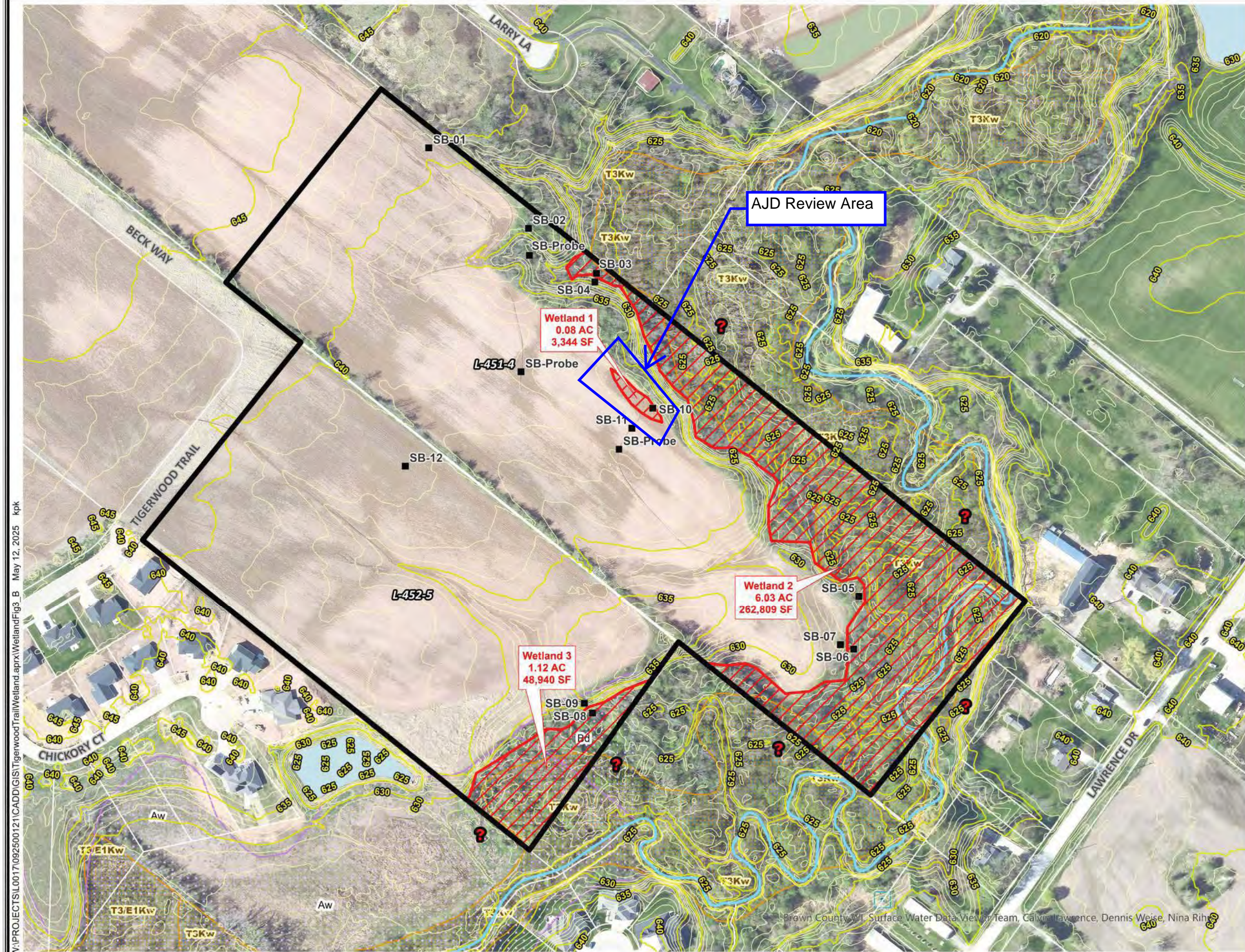

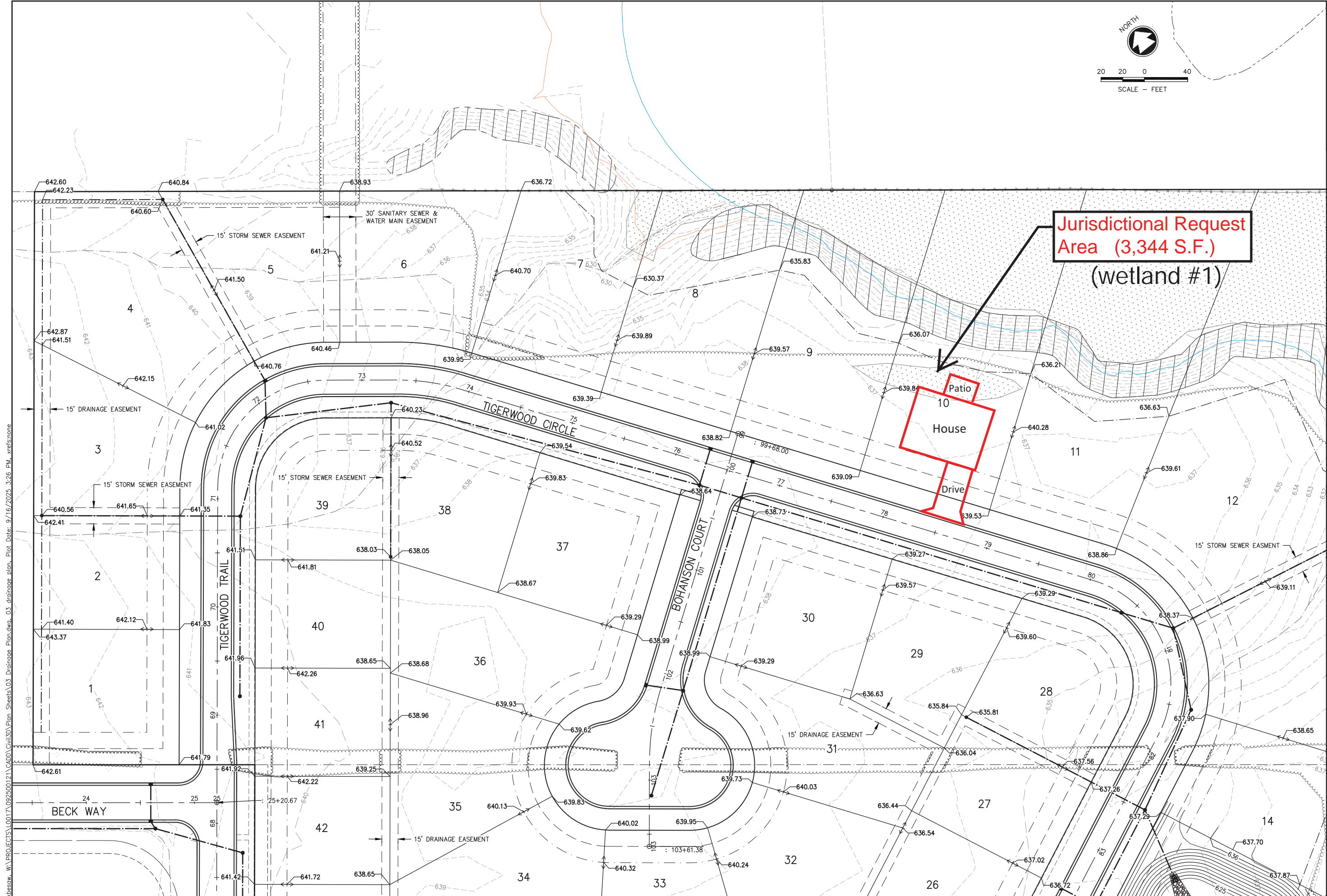

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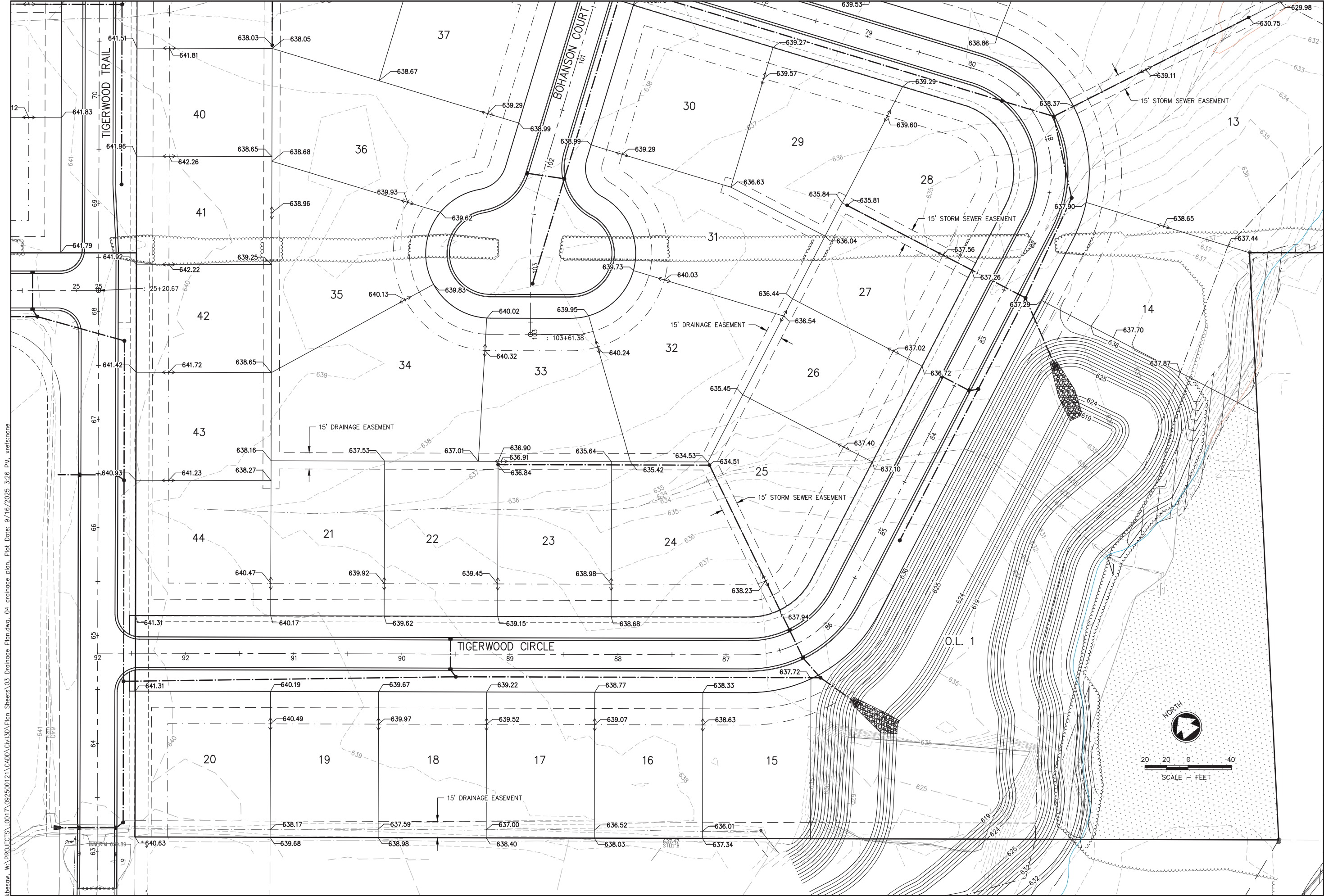
