Potentially jurisdictional waters and/or wetlands were assessed within the review area and determined to be not jurisdictional. Explain: The review area for this AJD includes four delineated wetlands on a parcel of farm land proposed for residential development located in the city of Mequon, Ozaukee County, Wisconsin. Wetland 3 is a 0.02-acre degraded wet meadow wetland dominated by reed canary grass located in a depression in the landscape. Wetland 4 is a 0.12-acre degraded wet meadow wetland dominated by phragmites grass located in a depressional area of excavated drainage ditch. Wetlands 6 is a 0.25-acre degraded wet meadow wetland located in a depression in the landscape. Wetland 7 is a 0.84-acre degraded wet meadow/shrubcarr wetland located within a depression in the landscape with two associated incoming drainage swales.

A thorough desktop review was conducted to identify any culverts and/or other hydrologic connections within and adjacent to the project site. The closest surface water found was a intermittent unnamed tributary located approximately 200 feet south of the review area. This unnamed tributary eventually flows to the Milwaukee River. However, there is no evidence Wetlands 3, 4, 6, & 7, have any hydrologic surface or sub-surface connection to the intermittent tributary.

Wetlands 3, 4, 6 & 7 do not support a link to interstate or foreign commerce because they are not known to be used by interstate or foreign travelers for recreation or other purposes; they do not produce fish or shellfish that could be taken and sold in interstate or foreign commerce; and they are not known to be used for industrial purposes for interstate or foreign commerce. Wetlands 3, 4, 6, & 7 have been determined to be non-jurisdictional under the Clean Water Act because the wetlands lack connections and/or relationships sufficient to serve as a basis for jurisdiction.
